Guest Speaker: Richardson City Manager, Don Magner Topic: The IQ – Richardson's Innovation Quarter

City Manager, Don Magner provided an update on the status of City Hall, a presentation on the Innovation Quarter (IQ) and the Downtown CORE District.

Update on City Hall:

The electrical fire on August 22, 2022 caused substantial structural damage to the first and second floors of the City Hall building. The City Hall building is expected to remain closed for approximately one year. The good news, according to Mr. Magner, is that city services were back up within 48 hours after the fire. Evaluations are currently underway to determine if the building can or should be repaired and renovated, or a new facility should be built on the existing site. Recommendations will be presented to the City Council after the evaluation is completed with a decision expected in the near future.

Innovation Quarter (IQ) Presentation:

A slide presentation of "Richardson Evolving Economic Development Strategic Plan" was shown. The strategy plan overview was presented of "Why now?" and "What we hope to achieve with the plan? The Richardson Innovation Quarter, also known simply as "The IQ" is a 1,200-acre urban hub that includes more than 1,000 businesses with over 19,000 employees. Mr. Magner stated the strategy is to "take the 1200 acres and focus on small business - establishing the small business will bring the large business."

Downtown CORE District:

The Core includes 5 areas: Richardson's Downtown, along with Richardson Heights, Interurban, Lockwood, and Chinatown areas. The Core is undergoing major changes with projects such as the new public safety campus and public art projects, building modernizations, business façade enhancements, public parking, open space, pedestrian improvements, and infrastructure. The City's support strategies for The Core include website development and maintenance, new branding, social and media responsibilities, event planning and programs, and a Merchants Association creation.
