Resource Coordinator, Animal Services, Richardson Animal Shelter, Luis DeLeon Assisted by, Richardson Animal Shelter and Health Director, Bill Alsup and Animal Control Officer, Daniel Gonzalez Topic: Animal Shelter Services Information & Facility Renovation Update

Resource Coordinator, Luis DeLeon and Animal Control Officer, Daniel Gonzalez provided a presentation on the status of the Animal Shelter facility renovations, an informative overview of animal services provided, and an educational review of important animal ordinances and laws.

Facility Renovation Update:

The Animal Shelter has temporarily moved into a facility located adjacent to the shelter where they will remain until the construction renovation is completed in March 2025 (project expected completion date). The shelter renovation project is part of the city's 2021 bond.

Updates to the facility will include:

- > A new main entrance with improved lobby
- > An entry façade
- Expanded staff offices
- New storage rooms
- Updated staff and public restrooms
- Updated break room

The renovation will not include additional kennel capacity.

Quote of note: "The shelter renovation will offer an upgraded experience for visitors."

Animal Shelter Services & Ordinance Information:

"The Richardson Animal Shelter strives to inform and protect our community through the explanation of local and state laws and ordinances." Resource Coordinator, DeLeon and Animal Control Officer, Gonzalez presented an in-depth explanation of the types of services offered and important animal control laws.

Types of services offered, some of which include:

- Public education
- Enforcement of City, State, and Federal laws
- Lost and found animal microchips
- Rabies control
- Vaccination requirements
- Neglected and abused animals
- Unsanitary conditions

Important pet ordinances discussed

- Lease laws Dogs must be restrained by means of a leash or chain of sufficient strength and not more than six feet to control the animal's actions while off premises.
 - $\circ~$ A retractable lease is considered "off-lease" where the owner commits an offense.
- Rabies vaccination owners are required to have a registration permit for dogs and cats indicating the animal is currently vaccinated. The current rabies tag must be securely attached to the animal's collar.
- Number of animals allowed
 - o four dogs / four cats
 - o eight hens (roosters are prohibited)
- Bite reports & quarantine all animal bites must be reported, including minor cuts and scratches. The animal will be quarantined for a ten-day observation period either in the home, shelter, or veterinary.
- Neglect & cruelty complaints Inhumane treatment of animals should be reported. Texas state law, commonly known as "Loco's Law", went into effect in 2001, making animal cruelty a felony and

punishable by a \$10,000 fine and up to two years in jail. The law was named for a puppy called Loco, whose eyes were intentionally gouged out.

- If you witness inhumane treatment of animals, call the animal shelter or call 911. Treatment such as, but not limited to:
 - Fail to adequately provide an animal with necessities of life, including food, water, sanitary conditions, shelter, or protection from the heat, cold, or other circumstances that may cause bodily injury, serious bodily injury or death of the animal.
 - Fail to provide basic grooming for an animal.
 - Cause or allow an animal to remain in its own filth.
 - Train an animal to fight another animal or possess animal fighting equipment.
- For more information, reference municipal code 5, section 5 -13.
- Noise & barking complaints it is unlawful for "any owner or person to allow an animal to unreasonable bark or make other unreasonable loud noise, unprovoked, that disturbs the peace and quiet of a person of ordinary sensibilities".
- Unsanitary conditions & "poop scooping" it is unlawful to allow an animal to defecate on any private or public property not owned by the person having control of the animal without the immediate removal of all feces.
- Wildlife animals are prohibited it is an offense to possess, keep or harbor any wild animal within the city.
 - o The city does not trap healthy wildlife unless it is severely injured or shows signs of sickness.
- Micro chipping of dogs and cats (New ordinance) an owner of a dog or cat commits an offense if the dog or cat does not have a microchip.
